

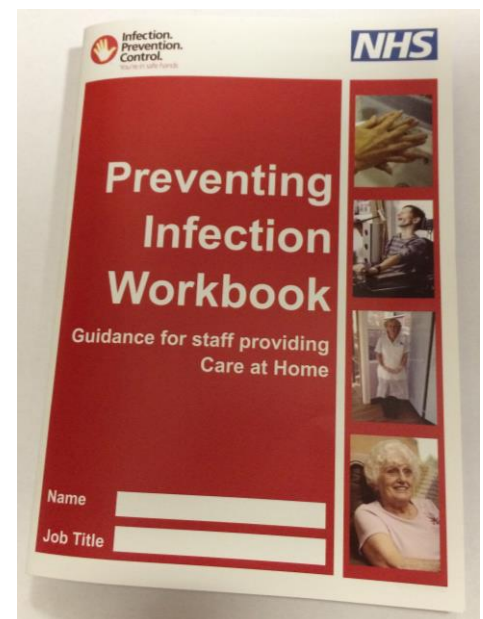
Preventing Infection Workbook: Guidance for staff providing Care at Home
