Your 5 moments for hand hygiene at the point of care

1	BEFORE SERVICE USER CONTACT	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands before touching a service user when approaching him/ her. To protect the resident against harmful germs carried on your hands.
2	BEFORE A CLEAN/ASEPTIC PROCEDURE	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands immediately before any clean/aseptic procedure. To protect the resident against harmful germs, including the service user's own, from entering his/her body.
3	AFTER BODY FLUID EXPOSURE RISK	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands immediately after an exposure risk to body fluids (and after glove removal). To protect yourself and the healthcare environment from harmful service user germs.
4	AFTER SERVICE USER CONTACT	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands after touching a service user and her/his immediate surroundings, when leaving the service user's side. To protect yourself and the healthcare environment from harmful service user germs.
5	AFTER CONTACT WITH SERVICE USER SURROUNDINGS	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands after touching any object or furniture in the service user's immediate surroundings when leaving—even if the service user has not been touched. To protect yourself and the healthcare environment from harmful service user germs.
