
How to use the 'Preventing Infection Workbooks'

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




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Example of the contents page of the workbook

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Step 2

All staff should complete all sections

If used for non-caregivers, can select relevant sections



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Example of a section in the workbook

Note

- Hand hygiene for residents is important and they should be encouraged to wash their hands or use moist (nonalcohol) skin wipes after using the toilet and before meals.
- Bars of soap and fabric hand towels should not be used by staff in resident's rooms or staff toilets as they harbour microorganisms. Wall mounted liquid soap and paper towels should be used.

Remember

- Handwashing is the single most important way to prevent the spread of infection.
- It is best practice to be 'Bare Below the Elbows' to facilitate good hand hygiene when delivering direct care to residents.
- Hands that are not dried properly transfer microorganisms more easily.
