Community Infection Prevention and Control Policies for General Practice

A **new set** of Community Infection Prevention and Control Policies for General Practice is now available. There has been a comprehensive review to ensure the Policies reflect national guidance.

Significant changes to the following policies

GP 01 Antimicrobial stewardship: New policy

reflecting the requirements of the revised 'Health and Social Care Act 2008: *code of practice on the prevention and control of infections and related guidance'*, (*Code of practice*), December 2022. It details the role of General Practice staff in ensuring appropriate antimicrobial use and stewardship to optimise outcomes for patients and reduce the risk of adverse events and antimicrobial resistance.

GP 02 Aseptic Technique: Addition of '2 in 1' product for cleaning dressing trolley and also use of alcohol swabs to wipe cleansing agent sachet before opening.

GP 06 Hand hygiene: Clarification relating to religious bangles, use of disposable over-sleeves, use of nail brushes and surgical hand antisepsis.

GP 08 MRGNB, including CPE: Change in terminology from MDRO and CPO.

GP 09 MRSA: Inclusion of information regarding naseptin and peanut/soya allergy.

GP 13 PPE: Consideration of overuse of PPE and its environmental impact. Revised glove selection.

GP 14 PVL-SA: Use of fluid resistant surgical mask for PVL-SA pneumonia and information regarding naseptin and peanut/soya allergy.

GP 16 Respiratory illnesses: New policy in accordance with the revised '*Code of practice*' covering transmission of viral respiratory infections and IPC management of patients with respiratory illnesses.

GP 17 Safe disposal of waste, including sharps: Use of temporary closure mechanism on sharps container 'when not in use'. Sharps containers no longer require disposal at 3 months. Waste bags to be secured when 2/3 full using a swan neck or plastic tie. Clarification of yellow and orange waste streams.

GP 19 Safe management of care equipment: Each Practice to have a designated Lead for Cleanliness.

GP 26 Venepuncture: Clarification regarding use of reusable tourniquets, gloves, skin decontamination and dressings. Addition of action in the event of a failed attempt.

GP 27 Viral gastroenteritis/Norovirus: Isolation of care home residents until 72-hours symptom free.
