## It might be gloves. It is always hand hygiene.



Disposable gloves do not protect you 100% and can get contaminated as easily as bare hands.



Gloves should be removed as soon as the care task has been completed. Hand hygiene is essential after glove removal.



Hand hygiene 'the right way' is still one of the most important measures to protect service users and healthcare workers.



Don't miss a 'Moment' of hand hygiene. Ensure staff are aware of the WHO 'My 5 moments of Hand hygiene' posters.



Excessive glove use contributes significantly to the volume of waste. Assess each task and decide if you need to use gloves.

#### Examples of when to use disposable gloves:

- If the activity may involve exposure to blood or other body fluid, including contact with mucous membranes and non-intact skin
- During contact precautions
- During outbreak situations
- Emptying or changing a urine drainage bag

Examples of when disposable gloves are **not** required (except for contact precautions):

- · Giving oral medication
- Assisting service users to get dressed or mobilise
- Taking a blood pressure
- Handing out meals or assisting service users with feeding
