



Bristol stool form scale

Please refer to this chart when completing a bowel history, i.e. stool chart record or transfer documentation, e.g. a patient passport or an 'Inter-health and social care infection control transfer Form'.

Definition of diarrhoea: an increased number (two or more) of watery or liquefied stools, i.e. types 5, 6 and 7 only, within a duration of 24 hours. Please remember, after removing gloves, hands must be washed with liquid soap and warm running water when caring for service users with diarrhoea.

Bristol stool form scale

Separate hard lumps, like nuts (hard to pass)
Sausage-shaped, but lumpy
Like a sausage, but with cracks on its surface
Like a sausage or snake, smooth and soft
Soft blobs with clear-cut edges (passed easily)
Fluffy pieces with ragged edges, a mushy stool
Watery, no solid pieces, ENTIRELY LIQUID
