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## **Designated Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) Lead**

In order to comply with the *Health and Social Care Act 2008: code of practice on the prevention and control of infection and related guidance*, the registered provider must identify a lead for IPC (including cleanliness).

- 1. The designated IPC lead is accountable and reports directly to the registered provider.
- 2. The designated IPC lead takes responsibility for:
  - Infection Prevention and Control
  - Cleanliness
  - Relevant antimicrobial stewardship principles
  - IPC management and structure
  - Establishment of relevant groups
- 3. The designated IPC lead should:
  - Oversee IPC Policies and their implementation, including undertaking and overseeing relevant audits
  - Work with other IPC system wide leads when required
  - Promote respectful challenge of inappropriate practice amongst all workers and have the authority to set and challenge standards of cleanliness
  - Assess the impact of all existing and new Policies on infection and make recommendations for change
  - Be an integral member of the organisation's governance and safety team structures, where they exist
  - Produce an annual statement with regard to compliance with practice on IPC (including cleanliness) and make it available on request
