Make reducing inappropriate glove use your New Year's resolution for 2026



DID YOU KNOW:

- Over 300 billion gloves are used in healthcare every year. It is estimated that between 30% and 50% of glove use is unnecessary
- Disposable gloves contribute significantly to carbon emissions from both their production and disposal
- If you make 2026 the year to reduce unnecessary glove use, you will save money and help reduce the environmental impact.
- The NHS as an organisation contributes between 4% and 5% of the UK's total carbon emissions

Improper glove use can increase the risk of infection

- Wearing disposable gloves gives a false sense of having clean hands. However, gloves can easily become contaminated just the same as your hands.
- Never apply alcohol handrub to gloves as the alcohol handrub may affect the integrity of the gloves.

Appropriate glove use

- ✓ Use gloves when anticipated or likely exposure to:
 - ◇ Blood and/or other body fluids
 - ◇ Non-intact skin/mucous membranes
 - ◇ Service user with a confirmed or suspected infection
 - ◇ Hazardous chemicals
- ✓ Gloves selected are appropriate for the tasks being undertaken, taking into account the substances being handled, type and duration of contact, size and comfort of the gloves.
- ✓ Use gloves as part of standard infection control precautions.

Gloves are not required

- ✗ If assisting a service user take their oral medication.
- ✗ When assisting a service user to get dressed.
- ✗ If you are helping a service user to eat or drink.
- ✗ When assisting a service user with their mobility.
- ✗ When completing administrative tasks.
